Franciscan Reflection

This Friday on the eve of the solemnity of St Francis of Assisi, Franciscans the world over and those who have a devotion to him gather for the Transitus - a commemoration of the passing of Our Founder from earthly life to eternal life in 1226. In this liturgy, an account of the final hours of St Francis is read including the context of the final two verses of the Canticle of the Creature.

Praised be You, my Lord, through our Sister Bodily Death,

from whom no one living can escape.

Woe to those who die in mortal sin.

Blessed are those whom death will find in Your most holy will,

for the second death shall do them no harm.

Praise and *bless* my *Lord* and give Him thanks and serve Him with great humility.

St Francis approached death not in fear but with open arms. While he was in the state of grace – a condition of a person who is free from mortal sin and pleasing to God – he was in friendship with God in order to attain heaven. Through sanctifying grace, God drew close to him. This state of grace, which began on earth at the moment of his baptism, responded during his lifetime as a child of God until his final breath, extended forever into eternity. He had nothing to worry about.

He greeted Sister Death as another expression of God's presence.

No one can escape death. That said, hopefully, when Sister Death arrives, she will find us in friendship with God and fulfilling His most holy will just like St Francis.
