First reading: *Isaiah 60:1-6*; Second reading: *Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6*; Gospel: *Matthew 2:1-12*

Today's Feast: The Holy Family

Today's feast of the Holy Family serves as a reminder of the importance of family life and the call of every family to holiness. We can turn to the rich teaching of Pope Saint John Paul II, in his 1981 apostolic exhortation, *Familiaris Consortio* (on the role of the Christian Family in the Modern World). He insists that the Christian family is not closed in on itself, but remains open to the community, moved by a sense of justice and concern for others.

One way it does this, the pope says, is to practice 'hospitality'. More broadly he calls families to a dedication to social matters, through a preferential option for the poor and disadvantaged.

Finally, he says, this "social role of families" must "find expression also in the form of political intervention". That means supporting and helping those in need not only through material help, but also through the social-political causes we support and the way we choose to vote.
