First reading: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6; **Second reading:** 1 Corinthians 1:1-3; **Gospel:** John 1:29-34

The Baptism of the Lord.

There are two important proclamations of God's word in today's gospel: one is the message of John the Baptist to his disciples, and the other is the voice of God the Father to his Son. In his baptism, Jesus is acknowledged as the beloved Son of the Father. In our own baptism, we get this same message – that God has chosen us as his sons and daughters. Sometimes, we lose sight of this essential truth and get bogged down in other things – stress, our jobs, our families, even our desire to follow Jesus. All these things can get in the way of recognising that we are *beloved*. Spend some quality time in prayer this week allowing God to love you as son or daughter, and recognize God's love in your life so that you can effectively share it with others.
