

Readings for next weekend — The Baptism of the Lord

First reading: *Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7*; Second reading: *Acts 10:34-38*; Gospel: *Matthew 3:13-17*

Guide us to thy perfect light

In some Christian traditions, the magi statues arrive at the Christmas Crib today, having made the long journey around a home or church. With our Nativity scene complete, we observe what is a rather diverse crowd: the wise men, some animals, Mary, Joseph and the baby, shepherds and some sheep. It's worth noting how tender this moment is. Despite the incarnation being an absolutely critical part of God's saving plan and the Most important event that has ever taken place in the history of the world, the Nativity is witnessed only by this small group of strangers. God comes to earth to save humanity, and for a few quiet moments, only a handful of people know that he has finally been born.

Aside from the arrival of the wise men, the Epiphany celebrates the manifestation of Christ to the world. He comes to embrace all peoples, especially those who find themselves cut off or separated from love, wholeness, peace and justice. All of the individuals gathered on this holy night have generously responded to the call of God and have heeded his voice. And now, having been guided by their faith and the light of the star, having met Emmanuel (God-with-us), they go forth by a different way and their lives are forever changed.

Our encounters with Christ – which at times are private and personal – always impel us to enact and share our faith in bold and radical ways. Each interaction with Jesus is a gift of grace that manifests in us a more authentic love, a deeper desire to be forgiven and to forgive, a new way to live out our vocation (married, single, religious). As we experience God-with-us and the faithfulness of God who has a plan for us (and our salvation), we are moved to share the gift of Christ with all people.

In the coming year there will be many opportunities for us to share the gift of Christ with other people and each other. Principally, we will be engaging in Alpha (beginning May 4th) as the primary means of evangelization. There will be Lenten reflection groups available, Parish-in-Council will be happening, Parish Expo in October and many other wonderful things are in preparation.

Point for reflection: *St. Paul's letter in today's 2nd reading addresses the conflict over whether both Jews and Gentiles were recipients of God's promises in Jesus. In whom do you most struggle to see God's face? Whom should we welcome in our parish community?*
